

Apache crew chief in Charlie Company, 1-151 Aviation. He was subsequently employed at the Army Aviation Support Facility in Eastover, first as an Apache technician and then to the technical inspectors office. Charles then deployed to Iraq for a year in 2010-11 in the technical inspector role. During this time he began the process of being accepted for flight school as a UH-60 Black-hawk pilot.

Returning to the states, Charles began UH-60 pilot training at Fort Rucker, and graduated in 2015. After being assigned to 1-111 General Aviation Support Battalion, he volunteered for a 4th deployment with the 10th Mountain Division in Charlie Company, 2-238 Aviation. Charles was based in Kandahar, Afghanistan as a MEDEVAC pilot during which he assisted with multiple combat missions. After arriving back in South Carolina, he decided to separate from the military after 20 years of service. Charles was recognized for his high standards of excellence with the Air Medal.

Charles and his wife, Melinda, who also served in the military, are busy raising two very busy, handsome boys. Charles is seen frequently at the MVCSC Compound helping others with vehicle repair and liberally sharing his mechanical expertise. MVCSC is grateful for Charles, who models service to others with enthusiasm and genuine warmth. Thank you, Charles, for leading the way!!

Charles Viohl Completes 20 Years of Military Service with Fourth Tour

Columbia native Charles Viohl credits his involvement with high school JROTC as his "jumping off point" for joining the military. Charles enlisted in the US Marine Corps in 2002. After finishing basic at Parris Island, he completed combat and water survival training.

Charles' next step was to graduate from CH-46 (Sea Knight) mechanics course and crew chief school. After assignment to HMM-162 as a flight line crew chief, he deployed to the Persian Gulf with the 26th Marine Expeditionary Unit aboard the USS

Kearsarge, an amphibious assault ship.

Upon return, Charles chose the option of transitioning to the V-22 Osprey, completing the V-22 mechanics and crew chief training requirements. He assisted with the standing up of VMM-162 and deployed to Iraq, replacing the first unit to deploy the V-22 in a combat zone. After this tour, Charles returned home and prepared to separate from the military.
