

Through our Charleston friend, Steve Riggs, and the reporting of Camden's *Chronicle-Independent*, we recently learned that the twelve Rev War Continentals we conveyed last year were interred in the Old Presbyterian Cemetery adjacent to the Quaker Cemetery in Camden on August 13, 2023. After the archaeological and anthropological analysis proved their identity as Continentals, the US Army took custody of the remains and chose their final resting place. The internment was conducted privately without public notification or additional ceremony. Each head-stone simply reads "UNKNOWN/REV WAR/BATTLE OF CAMDEN/AUG 16, 1780".

As reported by Camden's *Chronicle-Independent*, British authorities collaborated with Historic Camden to inter the Scottish Highlander where he fell on the battlefield on April 18, 2024. His grave is marked by a granite stone from Kershaw County. The ceremony was attended by 100 people, including the assistant military attaché' from the British Embassy and three soldiers from the Royal Regiment of Scotland, including a bagpiper.
